ACTIVITY	DESCRIPTION
<b>Bournemouth Walking Tour</b>	Students will be taken on an interesting walk around the city they will spend their stay in.
<b>Christchurch</b>	Christchurch has a choice of award winning beaches, coastal nature reserves, heritage attractions and a charming Quay. Two picturesque rivers, a stunning natural harbour and wonderful beaches. The historic Priory Church and Castle ruins help give an olde world charm to the attractive, bustling town centre with its range of independent shops and high street stores.
<b>Mystery shopping</b>	This activity gets students thinking about good and bad customer service and thinking about question forms in English when in various locations. Students must brainstorm good customer service and go to different locations and complete surveys through observations and questions to see how good their customer experience is in various places in town.
<b>Highcliffe Castle</b>	Students will be able to walk around Highcliffe Castle's grounds. It has been described as arguably the most important surviving house of the Romantic and Picturesque style of architecture, which flourished at the end of the 18th century and the beginning of the 19th century.
<b>Poole</b>	Its famous Harbour and sandy beaches will truly delight students. They will be able to take a stroll along the quayside, see the luxury Sunseekers across the water and walk around the award-winning parks and green spaces
<b>Treasure Hunt</b>	Student groups are given a list of items which they need to find. Points are awarded for each item and a prize is awarded to the winning team. Listening and reading skills are developed and relevant vocabulary is acquired. Communicative ability is developed in collaborating with team-mates.
<b>Song with Ben</b>	Sing along with Ben as he performs popular songs from the last 6 decades!
<b>Final presentation</b>	Project and prepare presentation based on the activity Mystery shopper
